




## MAAT

MAAT, Lisbon's beautiful new museum of art, architecture and technology, located on the riverfront near Belem (birthplace of the famous pastéis de nata (custard tarts) was designed by British architecture firm Amanda Levete Architects.

The curved, wave-like design of the building and the cantilevered structure provides shade for visitors who can walk over, under and through the museum. After visiting the exhibitions in the galleries inside, be sure to go to the rooftop with its lovely views of Lisbon and the Tagus river.





## THE CITY FOR FOOD LOVERS

## PASTÉIS DE BELÉM

Portuguese egg tarts are a must-have Portuguese pastry. Originally discovered by Portuguese nuns at Jerónimos Monastery in Belém, the sweet treats soon became popular and spread across the world. Pastéis de Belém is the original place that started selling Portuguese egg tarts, dating back to 1837.

The extremely crispy and flaky pastry filled with creamy rich centre has attracted dessert lovers from around the globe.
